The 2010-2011 winter was a long wet season in Wilsonia and Grant Grove, and one of the ten wettest on the books - probably coming in 4th, when the numbers are confirmed. In the seven-day storm beginning the first day of spring, 8' of snow fell, with a record setting 39" accumulation in one 24-hour period. There is still over 3' of snow on the ground in most places.

Season totals to date: Snowfall: 312.1" (average 180.97") from July 1st, 2010 to April 28, 2011 (data from the Kings Canyon Visitor Center)

NPS - Reed Canarygrass Project Updates

Greetings! I wanted to provide everyone an update on the reed canarygrass control project and to thank you all for your support and assistance throughout the project. We are entering the final year of our large-scale reed canarygrass removal project in Wilsonia. Crews have achieved control of the majority of the areas and will be focusing on eradication of the few remaining patches in the coming season. In addition to seeing crews out conducting control efforts around the area, you will also be seeing the removal of all tarps and planting of native species throughout the area. We will be hosting several volunteer groups that will be planting 20,000 native plants throughout the area! We are also interested in organizing a volunteer work day for members of the Wilsonia community to help with planting activities. I will be contacting landowners via phone and/or email in the coming weeks as dates are scheduled to alert you to crews working in the area.

It's Yard Clean-Up Time, Again

WVI asks you to set July 1st each year as the target date for having your property cleared of fallen branches and pine needles, and for creating a fire safe perimeter around your cabin and other buildings.


Once again, this year there will be open access to the Park Dump every weekend in June for disposal of your natural yard waste. On weekdays, and at all other times the rest of the year, you may gain access to the dump by signing out a key at the NPS Visitor Center.

IMPORTANT

No plastic trash bags are allowed at the dump! The only materials allowed in the dump are natural yard waste - pine needles and branches. No lumber, household trash or discards of any kind are allowed. No plastic bags!

Please make an effort to be in Wilsonia sometime during the month of June to clean your yards and make your cabin and our community FIRE SAFE! Remember, the clean-up responsibility falls on each property owner, whether or not you use your cabin.

Garbage service will resume in Wilsonia on Memorial Day weekend. This service is **only** for those Wilsonians who have helped to pay for the service by paying dues.

The disposal bill continues to be one of the biggest expenses for WVI. Please do not use the dumpsters for anything other than daily trash and kitchen garbage. If you bring up a large box or package (TV, furniture, etc.), please take the packaging back down the hill with you.

PLEASE! The dumpsters are <u>not</u> for the disposal of furniture, appliances, household discards, lumber or other building materials.

Please recycle all glass, cans and bottles. We will be working with Tulare County CCET to try to improve our recycling program. We do not have paper or cardboard recycling. Please burn them, reuse them or take them home to recycle.

Please protect the wildlife - keep the dumpsters latched, food and garbage out of site. Please keep your dogs on a leash.

outside their back door, and the supply of firewood was just a few steps away.

When John awoke in the early morning and looked out his second floor bedroom window, he was looking at bank of snow. Overnight, more than 3' had fallen, with drifts of over 7' from the snow blowing across the meadow. Needless to say, the Snowcat was buried, digging out for more firewood seemed an impossible task, and to top it off... the power was out. Thankfully, the phone was working. John was willing to rough it, but at the encouragement of a worried Kim, and just to be safe in case another 3' of snow might fall the next night, he thought he should get out. Kim called Keith Cosart, who then called Scott Edgerly. Scott and Keith headed up to the mountains that morning to help John dig out (it was also a great excuse to go to Wilsonia).

After chaining up at Snowline, they got to Wilsonia to find the parking lot buried and completely inaccessible. They unloaded Keith's Snowcat at the NPS maintenance yard and began the "rescue ride" to the Hills'. Scott, even with snowshoes on, was sinking up to his chest in the soft new powder. The Snowcat had to inch along, packing down, backing up, and inching forward again to make any progress. What should have been a fifteen-minute drive took close to five hours. Finally reaching John around 5 pm, they dug him out and gave him a ride out of Wilsonia.

John's Land Cruiser was buried in the parking lot under 6' of snow, but with some tugging from Keith's 4WD, they were able to, as John put it, "pop it out" of the snow and get out of there. They drove down to Bear Mountain Pizza, where John treated them to dinner and shoveled off some of the 3' of snow still frozen to the roof of his Toyota.

... 4 or 5 days after the "rescue", at the end of the week long storm, Scott and Allison Edgerly went back to Wilsonia.

The snow was so deep they needed to step over the phone lines to get into their cabin.
