

May 29th Duck Race Report - by Sara Klein

On a brilliant Wilsonia afternoon with the last sprinkle of precipitation hours behind the 3:00 start time of the Wilsonia Village Duck Race at the corner of Hazel and Lily Lane, the race began on time. A crowd of nearly 50 Wilsonians and one Park Ranger and his family gathered to witness and participate in this "quasi-annual" event.

Duck Race organizers Sara Klein and Sheri Parkinson narrowed the Rubber Ducks down to the smallest sizes as the stream in nearly it's last fluid days could only support smaller ducks. As it was, an occasional stray duck would be caught in the culvert mid-section or in twigs and would have to flushed out by willing helpers. The race started on the upstream side of Hazel and finished a few stones below the culvert bridge.

The first child's race with 10 participants finished with winning Duck #21, bought by Gianna Magnone; 2nd place with duck #29 went to Jizelle; and 3rd place with duck #13 to Ruby Parrack. The second child's race winner was Sydny Magnone with duck #34; 2nd place with duck #22 went to Ruby Parrack; and 3rd place with duck #37 to Noah Lawrence.

The Third race of the day brought in 14 adult participants who bought 17 ducks at \$5.00 each. The crowded field yielded an unknown winner: Lydia?, with duck #38.

Not willing to finish with the fun, another Child race was held with 6 participants. Surprisingly, duck #21 came in first again, with new owner Tristan Ramirez. Sister Teagan Ramirez came in second with repeat winner duck #34, and third place Analla Ver with duck #33.

At the finish line, Ty Parkinson and Mark Hickey called the winners.

Land Exchange within Wilsonia

As reported in the last Wilsonia Times, the intention of the Wilsonia Land Exchange Project is to return eleven or twelve National Park Service (NPS) owned properties to private ownership or potential leasing option in exchange for parcels of land in Wilsonia without structures.

The NPS will open a request for proposals in the fall for individuals who are interested in land exchange or lease. If you have undeveloped property in Wilsonia that you may consider selling, there are interested parties wanting to purchase land to use for the exchange.
